The Best Youth Retreat Ever

During Summer Camp, 2015, the staff in Haiti recognized unique needs of the teenagers and organized a special retreat to address these needs.

On Saturday, March 12, at 3PM, 41 young people ages 15-24 and 7 volunteer leaders arrived at an affordable, well-equipped conference space for an intense 25 hour period of learning about what God has to say about living and loving him and each other better. The group addressed issues such as peer pressure, spiritual growth and relationships.

Two of the leaders, Mr. and Mrs. Nelson, are well respected in church leadership and are the parents of three sons. Mr. Nelson enjoys mentoring and motivating youth because when he was young someone played that role in his life.

One participant wrote this on her evaluation:
I already feel that my life will be completely different after this retreat.

A Miracle Happened

In the darkness of midnight, by the light of her phone, Kerline, our director in Haiti, opened the packet of evaluations that she had received from the youths at the youth retreat. With shock and surprise, she read these words:

I am not Christian and some time I feel the desire to become a voodoo priest, and I feel like I want to drink blood. I want the leaders to pray for me about that.

Dante, a gentle, open and respectful young man, had penned those words. In dismay, Kerline reflected on how the devil wanted to ruin his life. She gave him a Bible and asked an elder to mentor him and pray for him but he did not decide to give his life to the Lord.

A few weeks later, at the Annual Meeting of the Haitian Committees, Dante was one of the students receiving tools for the trade he is working in. With a heavy heart, one of the leaders talked to him personally about the need to accept Jesus as his Savior. As she spoke, she started to cry. Dante fell on his knees and could not stop weeping. One leader took him aside and 30 minutes later they returned to announce that Dante had accepted the Lord. He removed his necklace and announced that he also wanted to remove certain items from his home. The leaders created a prayer chain around Dante and erupted in a round of applause.

Since then, the leaders have given Dante clothing appropriate for church and a telephone so that they can communicate with him. They have enrolled him in a class for new believers and have found a mentor to guide him in his newfound faith.



