On the Ground in Haiti


Dear members of the Rescue One family,

Over and over again we heard this message from the children: "Without you I would not be here." Over and over again they tell of parents who have died, who lost their job, are sick or who have neglected them.

The program is so much more than food and education. It is nurture for the souls of these children and has become family to them. They look to the staff of the program for advice and even call one of the coordinators "mommy/daddy." You are an integral portion of that family. The children tell us that they pray for you even though they have never met you.
